



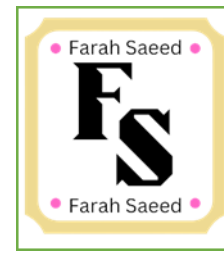

This painting presents Masjid Al Aqsa in Palestine where there is a flame behind it emphasising the unnecessary anger and fighting and the freedom to pray and live peacefully in Palestine. The use of the colours are bold, sincere and focused in freeing Palestine.

About Art piece: This Art piece presents the outline of Palestine in a Towqi Arabic calligraphy format. The colours denote the Palestinian flag: red, green, white, and black. Surrounding the map on one side is the name of one of the cities called Gaza, written in Thuluth script with a bleeding heart. Palestine in English calligraphy with the Palestinian Kuffiyeh scarf. At the top of the map is a glowing bird that links the whole trial with a verse from the Quran that says in Naskh script:

"Don't Lose Hope In ALLAH's Mercy" [Quran, Sura Al Zumr (The Groups) 39:53]





Haifa

Name of Art piece: The Palestinian Cultural jigsaw.

Each square piece presents the main cities and towns of Palestine in Kufic calligraphy script using the colours of the Palestinian flag: black, red, white and green.

On the second half of the art piece, Haifa presents some of the Palestinian tatreez patterns after being inspired by the shape, content, form and meaning: single spear, partial Damask rose, cypress, moon of Ramallah, Garden rose or rose on the bud and the flower pot.

Palestine is written in bold black using the Thuluth script and is translated with English Calligraphy.

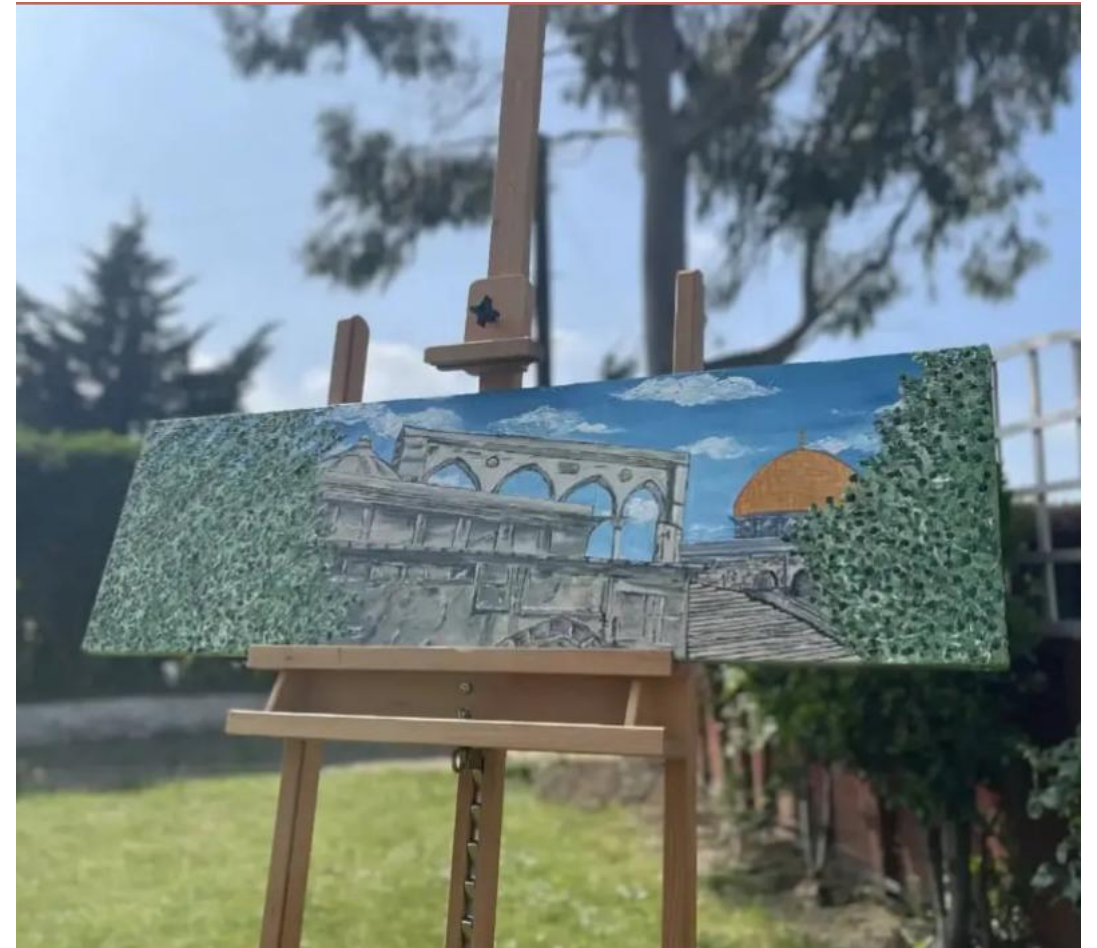

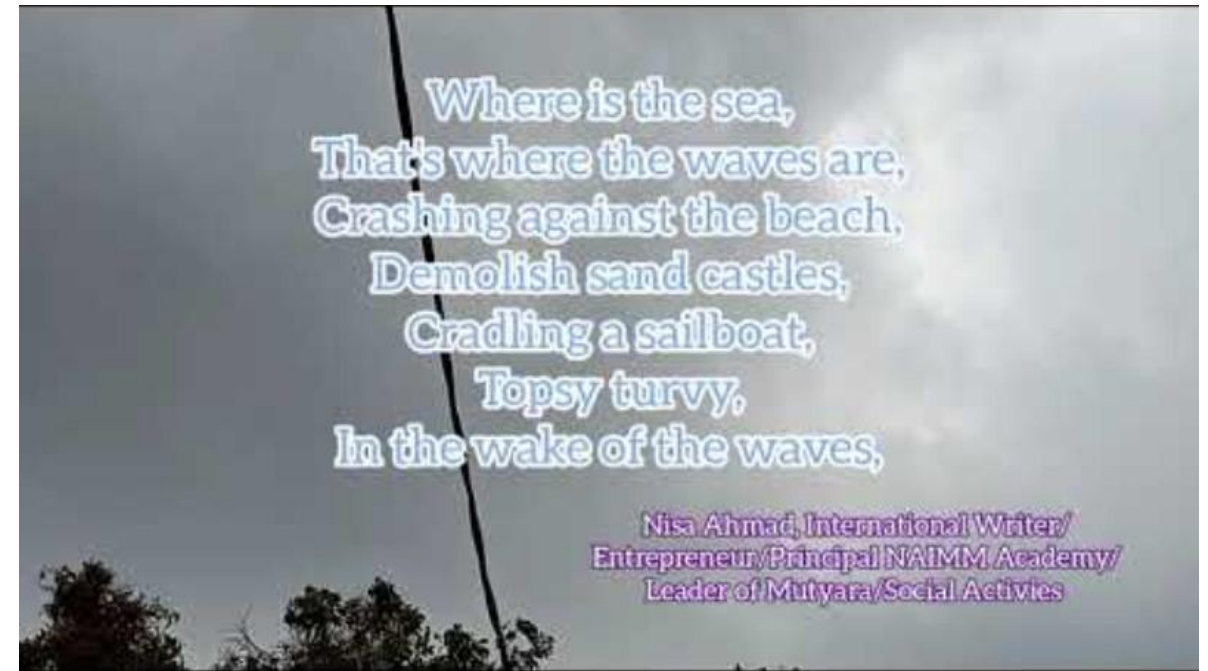

Dish 1: Maklouba

Maklouba or Maqluba means upside down and is a traditional Palestinian dish composed of fried aubergine, onion with tomatoes, spiced rice and meat or chicken.

There are alternative ways of its preparation, for instance, some prefer cauliflower instead of aubergine, and others choose to add potato. It can be decorated with nuts as an option.

Dish 2: A traditional Palestinian breakfast.

A traditional Palestinian breakfast involves several delicious dishes. Manakeesh is a Middle-Eastern flatbread topped with either za'atar (thyme), dukka and cheese. It is served with hummus (chickpeas) and fowl Mudammas (fava beans).

Falafel is a deep-fried ball made from soaked chickpeas , broad beans, or a combination of both. It is served with the Gazawi salad placed in a mortar made in Gaza and with a clay from Gaza which gives it a special flavour. The salad and any of the food can be served alone as a breakfast and is not necessary to be served with anything else.



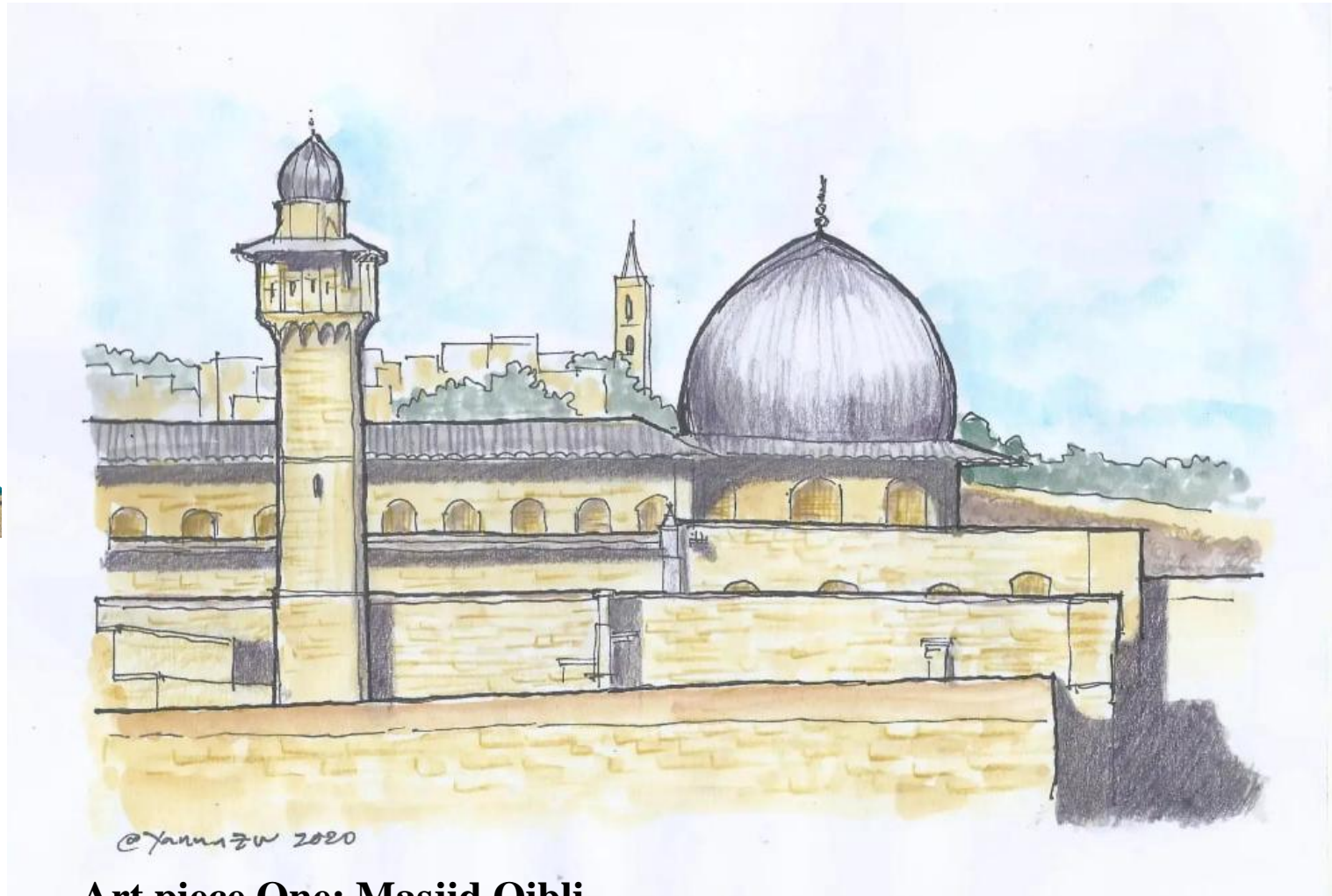


Yanna Zulaidha Widiastuti

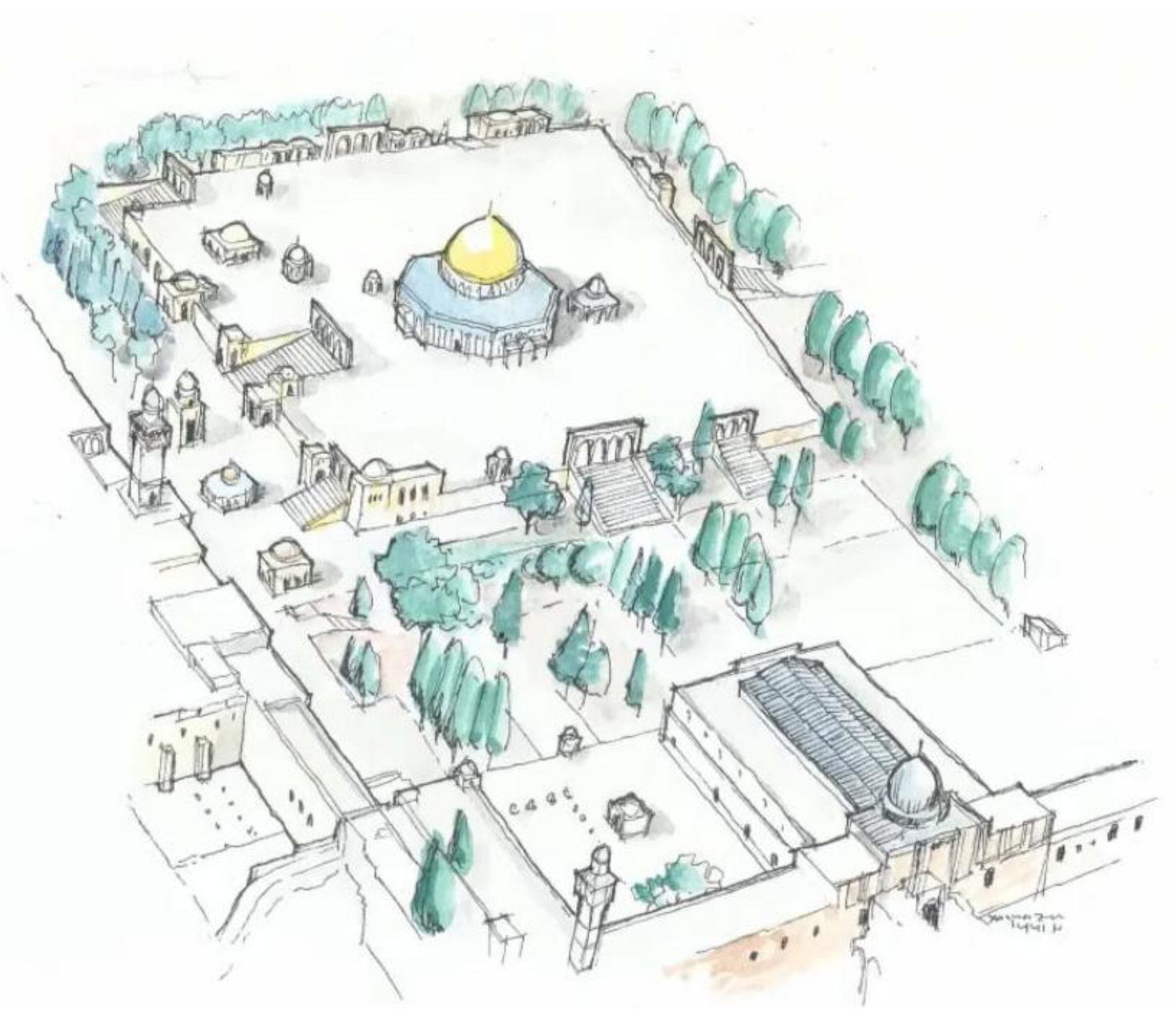
