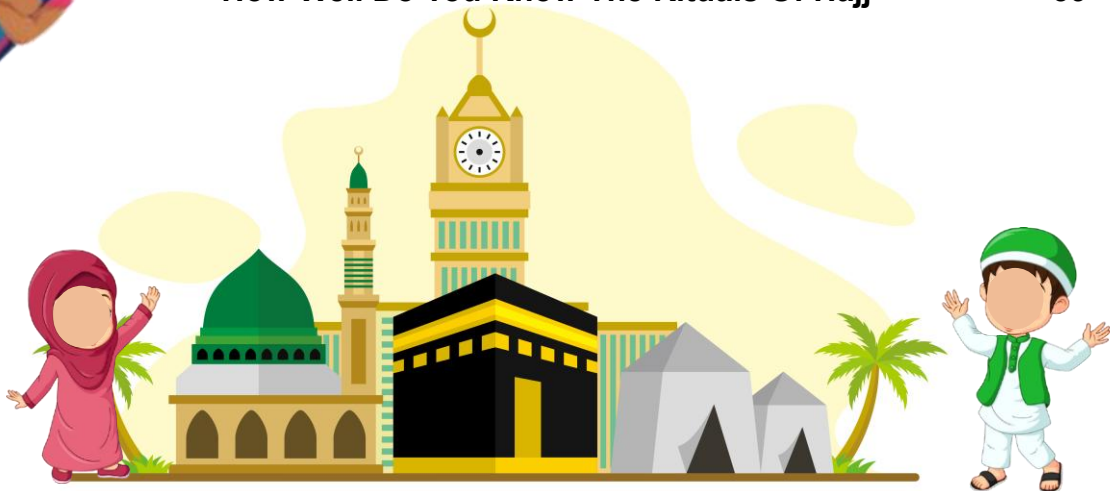

# The Importance Of The Kaabah

Billions of Muslims perform prayer five times a day, facing the Holy Kaabah in the Masjid Al-Haram in the Hejaz Region of Makkah, Saudi Arabia. This spiritual unity teaches us the true purpose in life. Every Muslim dreams of visiting the Holy Kaabah, whether to perform Umrah or Hajj.

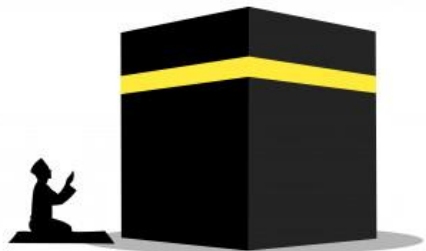
There are several events that unite Prophet Ibrahim's son, Prophet Ismail (peace be upon him), with the spiritual pilgrimage of Hajj. Amongst them is building the Kaabah's foundation. He was obedient to Allah's command when his father asked him to sacrifice him. Zamzam was the water blessed by Allah to Hajar, who was searching for water between Mount Safa and Marwa and walked seven times (Sa'ee). His descendants were the seal of the Prophets, Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him).



# The Importance Of The Kaabah

These stories and rituals remind us of the importance of faith, patience, and obedience in daily life. For young Muslims, reflecting on the determination of Hajer, the trust of Prophet Ibrahim, and the unity experienced in facing the Kaabah can inspire them to remain steadfast in their prayers, uphold good deeds, and find strength in times of hardship.

# DO YOU KNOW?

## FACTS



### Fact One:

The Kaabah is also known as Bait Al-Atiq, Bait Al-Haram, Bait Allah and Khana Kaaba.

### Fact Two:

The Kaabah is not Allah's home but is a metaphorical representation where it presents the centre point for Hajj and Umrah and direction of the prayer (Qibla).

### Fact three:

There are two Kaabahs. One is in Makkah, and the other is in the seventh sky, right above the Kabah, called Bait Al Mamoor.

The Messenger (peace be upon him) of Allah, after returning from Miraj (Night Journey), said, *"Then I was shown Bait-ul -Mamur (the Frequented House). I asked Angel Jibreel about it, and he said, "This is Al Bait-ul-Ma'mur, where 70,000 angels perform prayers daily, and when they leave, they never return to it (but always a fresh batch comes into it daily till the Day of Judgment)"*

# DO YOU KNOW?

## FACTS



### Fact four:

The foundation of the Kaabah was built by Prophet Ibrahim and his son Ismail more than 5000 years ago. It was rebuilt in the 6th century, in 608 CE, by the Quraysh tribe to protect the Kaaba from floods and later improved in 1996.



### Fact five:

Al-Shaibi family are the guardians of the Kaabah for thousands of years (centuries) until the Last Day who are allowed to pray inside twice a year. This includes appointed governmental official etc.

This happened on the conquest of Makkah where Prophet (peace be upon him) and he returned them back to Osman ibn Talha of the Bani Shaiba family.

Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said:

*“Take it, O Bani Talha, eternally up to the Day of Resurrection, and it will not be taken from you unless by an unjust, oppressive tyrant.”*

### Fact six:

Inside the Kaabah, you can pray Salah in any direction.

### Fact seven:

The Black Stone (Hajj Al Aswad) is from Heaven and is made of different rocks.

### Fact eight:

The original dimensions were a semi-circle called Hijr Ismail (Hateem). The building was rectangular in shape and reached a height of four and a half meters. It contained two doors at the ground level but had no roof. However, the Kaabah is located in an area where it flooded every year as it was deep in the valley of Farhan. The Quraysh leaders rebuilt it to a cube shaped structure a few years before Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) had his first revelation from the Quran.

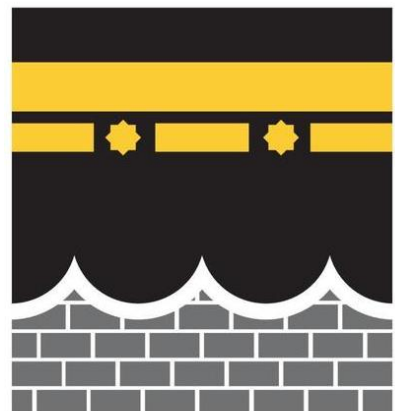

### Fact eleven

The name of the Kaaba cloth is called the Kiswah and has real gold embroidery made of Quranic verses. This was started by the Abbasid caliphs, whose household colour was black. The original colours were green, red, and white.



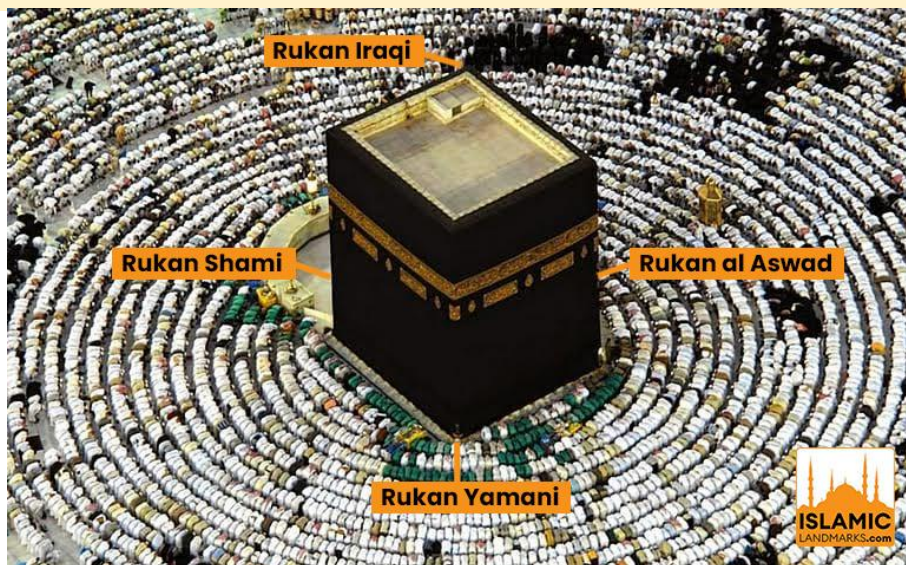

### Fact twelve

The Kaabah is a cube-shaped structure with four corners (Arkan). Each corner (Rukn) of the Kaabah is a reference points during Tawaf that help make a flow of worship and keeps pilgrims following the Sunnah evenly. Rukn al-Aswad (Black Stone Corner), Rukn al-Yamani (Yemeni Corner), Rukn al-Shami (Levantine Corner), and Rukn al-Iraqi (Iraqi Corner) face a particular country. The Levant of Greater Syria includes Palestine, Jordan, and Lebanon. They are general directions, not specific country borders. Only Rukn al-Aswad and Rukn al-Yamani have Sunnah actions associated with them. The Prophet (peace be upon him) touched Rukn al-Yamani, but he did not kiss it. This is why it is a Sunnah action.

# How Well Do You Know The Rituals Of Hajj?

1. Pilgrims may stop at Masjid Al-Namirah and listen to the khutbah (sermon).

3. Pilgrims shave their heads, remove ihram, and return to Makkah.

5. At sunrise, pilgrims go from Mina to Arafah.

7. Go to Makkah and perform Tawaf al-Ifadhah.

8. The pilgrims enter Ihram by making intention (niyyah).

The male pilgrim wears two white sheets, whereas a female pilgrim wears clothing of any colour that covers her body apart from her face and hands.

2. At sunset, pilgrims go to Muzdalifah, which is between Mina and Arafat, and they camp at night.

4. Pilgrims pray Dhuhr and Asr together at Arafah.

6. If Tawaf al-Ifadhah was not performed on the 10th or 11th of Dhul-Hijjah, go to Makkah and complete it with Sa'ee, then return to Mina.

9. Collect 70 pebbles in Muzdalifah or Mina for stoning the Jamarat.

10. If Tawaf al-Ifadhah was not performed on the 10th, go to Makkah and complete it, and then return to Mina..



# How Well Do You Know The Rituals Of Hajj?

11. Drink Zamzam water and make Dua.

13. Pray Rakaat (two units of prayer) behind the Station of Ibrahim (Maqam Ibrahim), or anywhere in Masjid Al Haram (Sacred Mosque)

15. Pilgrims go to Jamarat al-Aqabah al-Kubra after sunrise. 7 pebbles each Jamarat (21 total) (Rami Al Jamarat, reciting 'Allahu Akbar' 'God is great' with each throw, make dua. This is when Prophet Ibrahim was commanded by Allah to sacrifice Ismail. Iblis (Shaytan) tempted him to disobey three times.

18. Pilgrims go to the tent camp near Mina between after Fajr and before Dhuhur (mostly in the morning).

12. Eid al-Adha (Festival of the Sacrifice) takes place, celebrating Ibrahim's submission to Allah.

14. Perform Sa'ee (walking between Safa and Marwa) and then return to Mina.

16. Pilgrims face Qiblah, recite the Talbiyah "Labbayk Allahumma Labbayk" "Here I am, O Allah, here I am", and leave Makkah.

17. After Zawaal (midday), stone all three Jamarat with 7 pebbles each (21 in total), reciting Allahu Akbar (God is Great) with each stone or pebble.

19. When pilgrims reach Mount of Mercy (Jabal Al-Rahmah): fasting, making dua facing the Qibla, seek forgiveness, and stand in prayer (Wuqoof) until sunset.

21. Pilgrims return to Mina.

23. Pilgrims pray Maghrib and Isha together at Muzdalifah.

25,. Final Stoning of the Jamarat (reciting Allahu Akbar/God is Great) and go to Makkah to perform Tawaf Al-Wadaa (Farewell Tawaf).

27. Spend the night in worship in Muzdalifah or sleep until Fajr.

20. Depart Mina for Makkah before sunset on the 12th of Dhul-Hijjah if possible. If unable to leave before sunset, remain in Mina.

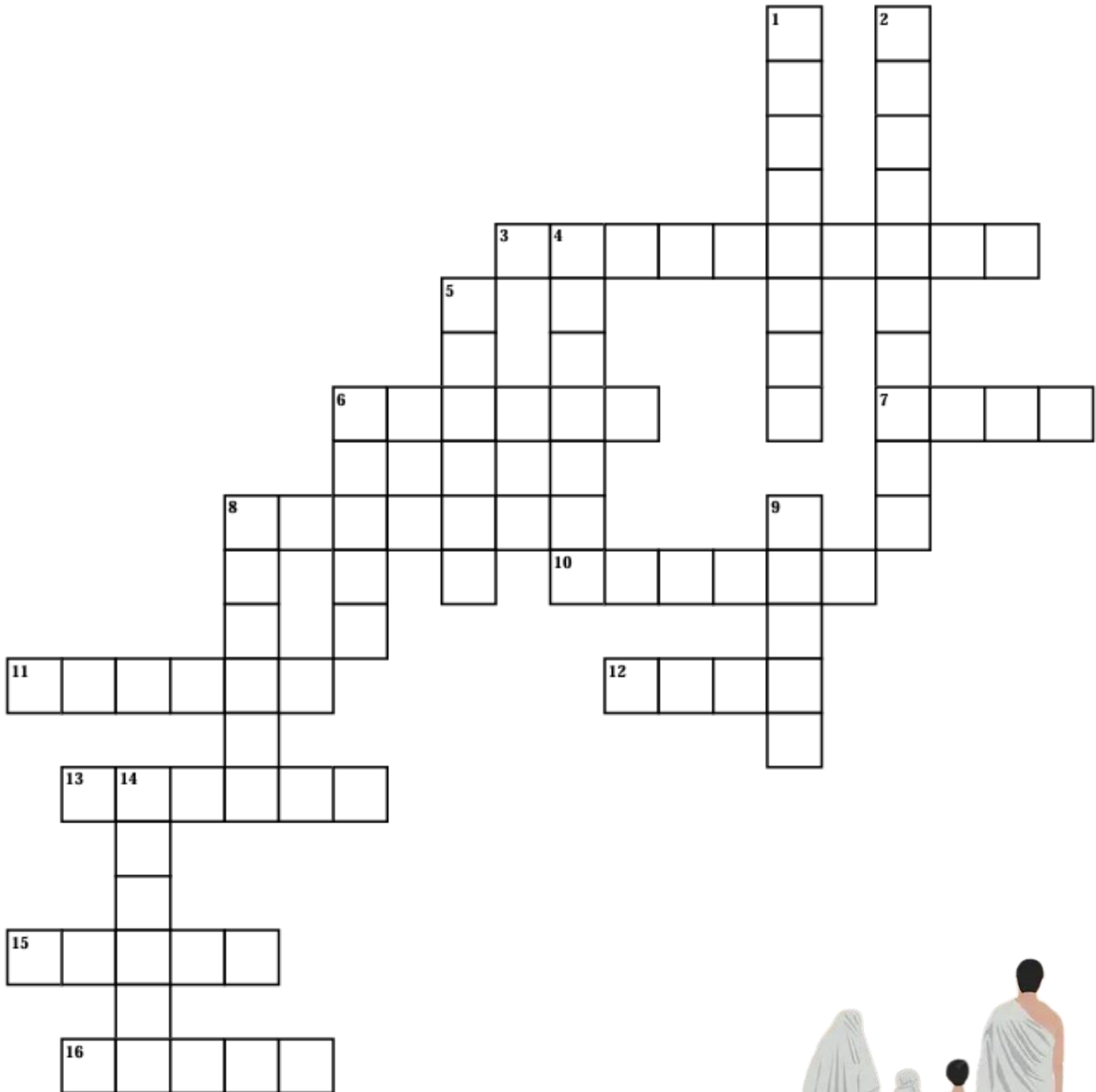
22, After Zawaal (midday), stone all three Jamarat — 7 pebbles each (21 total), reciting 'Allahu Akbar' with each throw.

24,. Pilgrims sacrifice a lamb (Udhiyah/Qurbani) as Allah sent a lamb from heaven due to their obedience to Allah's commands..

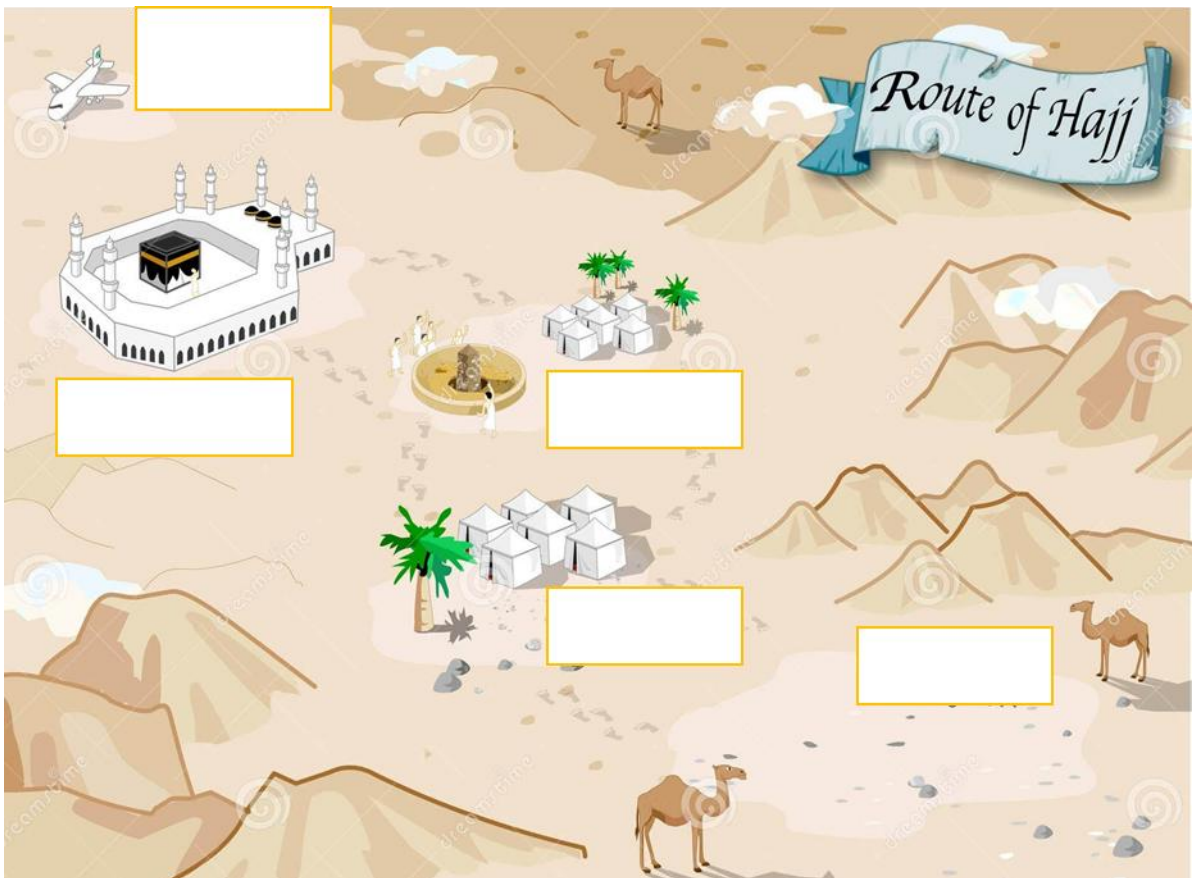

## How Well Do You Know The Rituals Of Hajj (P39)

### 1st Day (8th Dhul Hijjah)

#### Statement Numbers: 8, 16, 18 and 26

The pilgrims enter Ihram by making intention (niyyah). The male pilgrim wears two white sheets, whereas a female pilgrim wears clothing of any colour that covers her body apart from her face and hands.

Pilgrims face Qiblah, recite the Talbiyah "Labbayk Allahumma Labbayk" "Here I am, O Allah, here I am", and leave Makkah.

Pilgrims go to the tent camp near Mina between after Fajr and before Dhuhr (mostly in the morning)

Pilgrims pray Salah Dhuhr, Asr, Maghrib, and Isha at Mina.

### 2nd Day Yawmu Arafah (The Day of Standing).

#### Statement Numbers: 1, 2, 4, 5, 9, 19, 23 and 27

At sunrise, pilgrims go from Mina to Arafah.

Pilgrims may stop at Masjid Al-Namirah and listen to the khutbah (sermon)

When pilgrims reach Mount of Mercy (Jabal Al-Rahmah): fasting, making dua facing the Qibla, seek forgiveness, and stand in prayer (Wuqoof) until sunset.

Pilgrims pray Dhuhr and Asr together at Arafah.

At sunset, pilgrims go to Muzdalifah, which is between Mina and Arafat, and they camp at night.

Pilgrims pray Maghrib and Isha together at Muzdalifah.

Collect 70 pebbles in Muzdalifah or Mina for stoning the Jamarat.

Spend the night in worship in Muzdalifah or sleep until Fajr.

## How Well Do You Know The Rituals Of Hajj (P39)

### 3rd Day (10th Dhul Hijjah) Yaum Al Nahr (The Day of Sacrifice)

**Statement Numbers: 3, 7, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 21 and 24**

Pilgrims return to Mina.

Pilgrims go to Jamarat al-Aqabah al-Kubra after sunrise. 7 pebbles each Jamarat (21 total) (Rami Al Jamarat, reciting 'Allahu Akbar' 'God is great' with each throw, make dua. This is when Prophet Ibrahim was commanded by Allah to sacrifice Ismail. Iblis (Shaytan) tempted him to disobey three times.

Pilgrims sacrifice a lamb (Udhiyah/Qurbani) as Allah sent a lamb from heaven due to their obedience to Allah's commands. (10th Dhul Hijjah).

Eid al-Adha (Festival of the Sacrifice) takes place, celebrating Ibrahim's submission to Allah.

Pilgrims shave their heads, remove ihram, and return to Makkah.

Go to Makkah and perform Tawaf al-Ifadhah.

Pray Rakaat (two units of prayer) behind the Station of Ibrahim (Maqam Ibrahim), or anywhere in Masjid Al Haram (Sacred Mosque)

Drink Zamzam water and make Dua.

Perform Sa'ee (walking between Safa and Marwa) and then return to Mina.

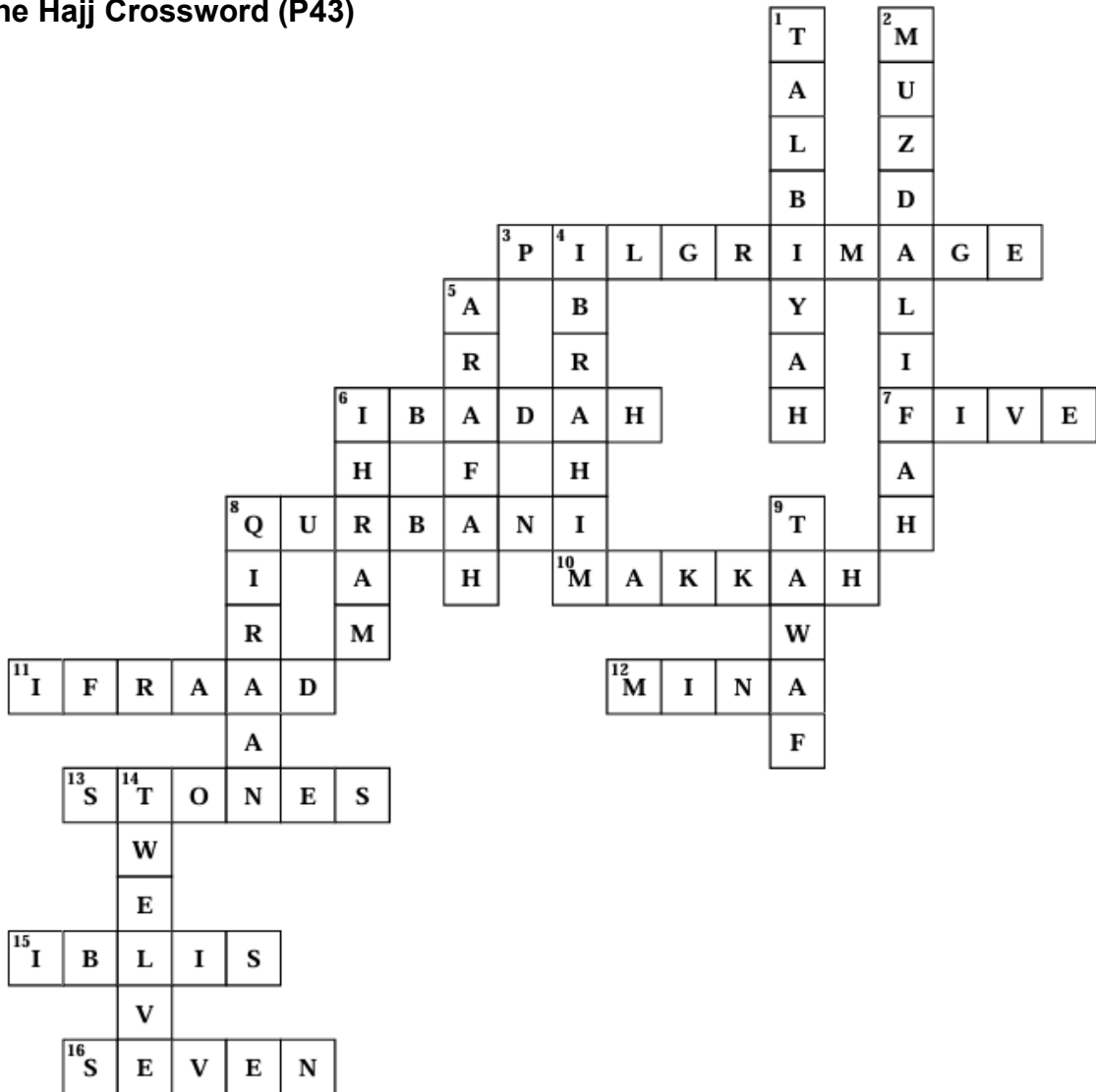
### 11th Dhul-Hijjah

**Statement numbers: 10 and 22**

If Tawaf al-Ifadhah was not performed on the 10th, go to Makkah and complete it, and then return to Mina.

After Zawaal (midday), stone all three Jamarat — 7 pebbles each (21 total), reciting 'Allahu Akbar' with each throw.

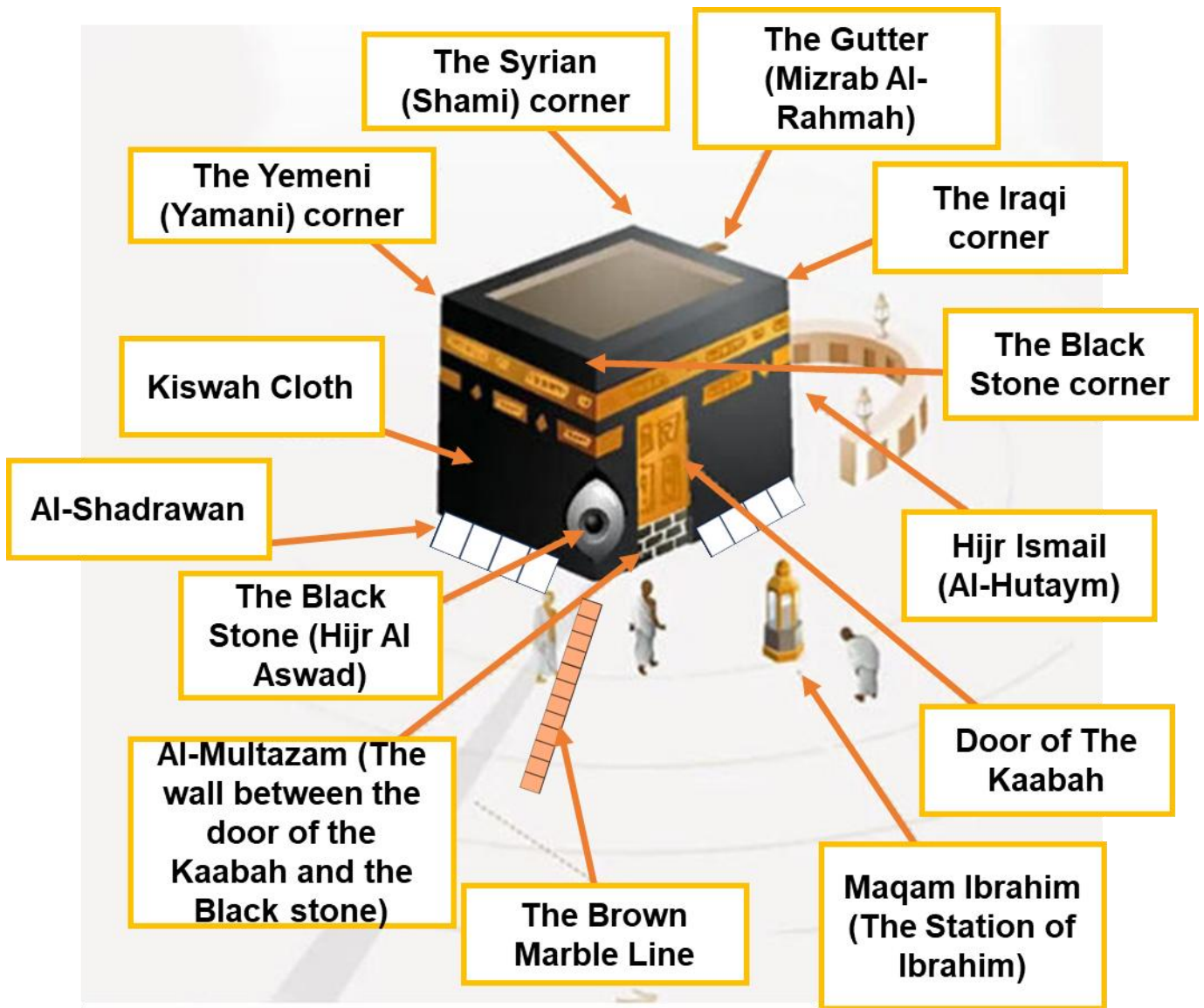

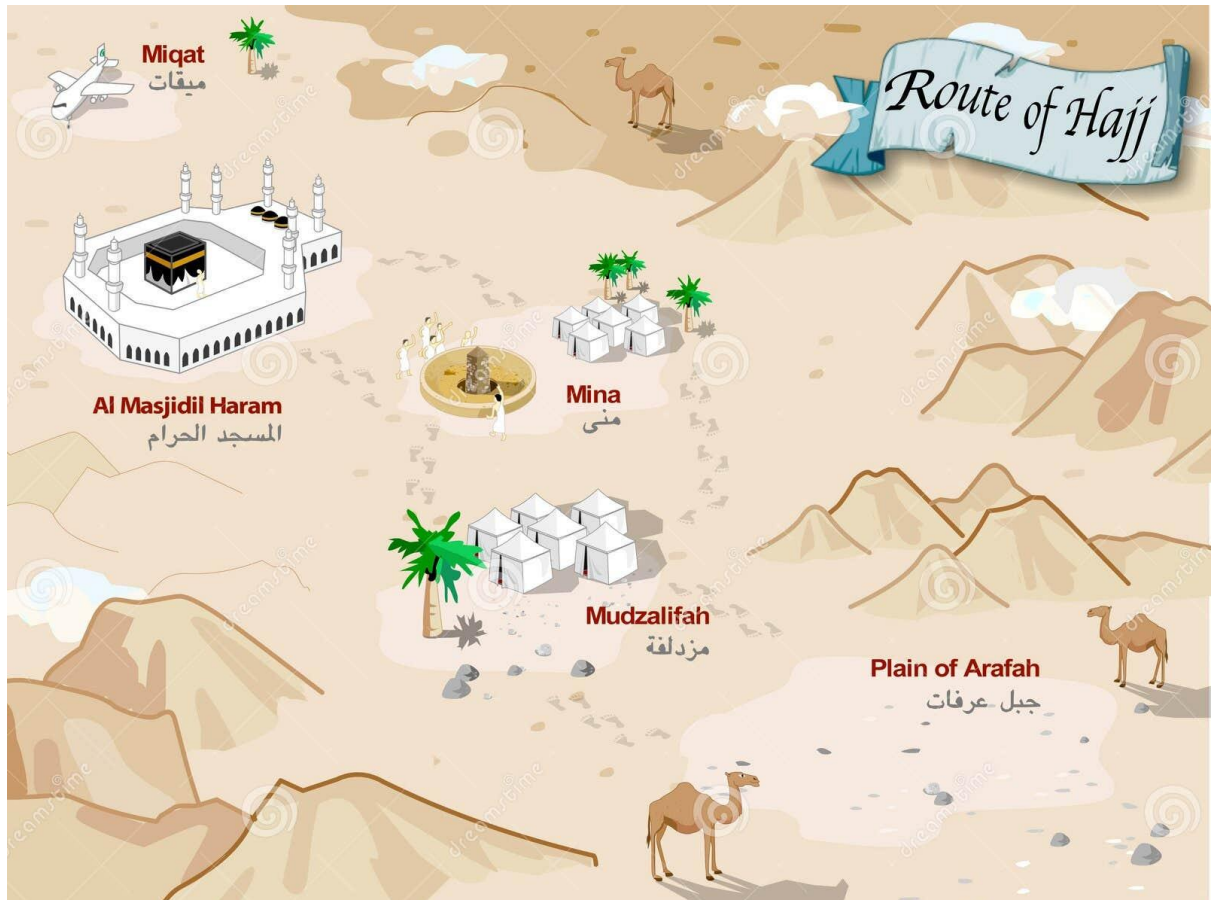
